

a mile or two in advance of the forest fire, and then that spotting fire eventually feeds the big fire behind it. And I think that is kind of the concept that we are being asked to employ, and you can't be in the area between the spot fire and the big forest fire behind it because you will be consumed in the buffer zone. I don't think we should allow cities to spot out in that area in that fashion. It doesn't protect the people that are between the spot fire and the city, itself. It doesn't protect the interests of the rest of the State of Nebraska. The flexibility that is granted in this proposal is too great for the needs of the Micron project and probably too great for the needs of any other project. I think we can examine this proposal, not only in the way that Senator Jones has suggested in placing a two-mile restriction on it, but other proposals that will tailor this proposal more specifically to the needs of Micron and the project that they are proposing. I think that we can do that. We can perhaps be sensible about that without giving away big chunks of what we had previously...
