CLERK: Senator Landis voting yes. Senator Elmer voting...

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Wickersham asks for a roll call vote. We still have five senators who have not checked in. Senator Bernard-Stevens and Senator McKenzie, will you please check in. Senator Bohlke. Senator Bohlke and Senator McKenzie, will you please return to the Chamber and check in. There is a call of the house. Senator Brown says we may go ahead with the roll call vote. The question is whether to cease debate on Senator Jones amendment to LB 830. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 777 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 14 nays to cease debate.

SENATOR CROSBY: Debate ceases. Senator Jones, would you like to close on your amendment. I will raise the call.

SENATOR JONES: Madam President and members of the body, I just wanted to bring this to a point because I can just think of the agricultural ground across our state and how ten miles would affect it. You get a lot of towns out there that is 20 miles apart, well, that encompasses all the agricultural ground, so I think that is really important. I realize the county has to approve the final decision on it but the ten miles is just too...you know, it just reaches out too far. I think Wickersham brought out a real good point on a fire that would jump and make a spark out another 100 or so yards, and then you have to fight that, too, and I think that would get bigger as it goes out. So with that, I think I will just close on that, and thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Jones. You've heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the Jones amendment to LB 830. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk. Someone requested a record vote.

CLERK: Thank you. (Record vote read. See pages 777-78 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 32 nays, Madam President, on the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is not adopted.
