SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Madam Chairman and members. I would like to ask Senator Warner a question if I might.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: ...what happens if no company is issued an application within two years with LB 830?

SENATOR WARNER: Sunsetting.

SENATOR WARNER: February, the date is February 1, 1997.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: So the whole...the whole bill goes away then?

SENATOR WARNER: The bill in its entirety.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Entirety, LB 829, too?

SENATOR WARNER: That's the proposed amendment in that case, yes.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Can the same company use LB 775 and LB 830?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: So if Micron comes in they will use 775 first, and then 830 will kick in after that?
