

Mr. Clerk, and a record vote has been requested.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 778-79 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 22 nays, Madam President, on the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is not adopted. Mr. Clerk, we have a motion. Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Madam President, and thank you for recognizing me here. I am going to make a slight modification on today's agenda. There is a need to change a hearing date. One of our less experienced committee chairs evidently made a mistake in setting hearings, so we will modify that there. And if people can stick around just a moment or two to hear the motion, because it does take a 30 vote, so that motion will be before the body at this point.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Lindsay, on your motion.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I am kind of inexperienced. How do I do this, Ron? The Judiciary Committee has a...we have a motion to cancel the hearing on LB 569 that was set for next Wednesday. We overscheduled. We put 14 bills instead of 13, and we will...actually, it is a bill that I had made some...had discussions with people who were going to be there to testify, they are going to be out of town. They had asked may anything but next week, and in typical style, I put it next week. So I am asking that hearing be cancelled. I believe all...I talked to the sponsor of the bill, Senator Brashear, and I don't think there is any problem with it. I'd urge that the rules be suspended to allow cancellation of that hearing.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Any discussion on the motion to suspend the rules? Seeing none, Senator Lindsay. He waives closing. The question is to suspend the rules on Senator Lindsay's motion. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 3 nays, Madam President, on the motion to suspend the rules to cancel the hearing.
