Wesely is going to withdraw his amendment I feel it's probably not the proper time to take up the discussion, so I'll waive off. Thank you.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Coordsen has not returned to the Chamber. Senator Wesely, your light is next.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. President, members, in light of Senator Withem's comments, I will ask that the amendment be withdrawn at this time, and I look forward to working with him, Senator Kristensen and Senator Vrtiska and anybody else interested. But I think it's a key point that what we've learned from 775 is what we're told might happen and what happens, you can never totally anticipate. And having the chance to review the decision and the impacts of the decision is a very wise legislative policy, in my view, and I'm glad Senator Withem is interested in working on it. With that, I'd ask that the amendment be withdrawn.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you very much, Senator Wesely. If there is no objection, the amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, next item on the bill.
