Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, Madam President, members of the body, Senator Bromm indicated he wanted me to consider whether I found it in my heart to accept this amendment. Actually, I don't have to go that deep, Senator Bromm. I think what...I think, number one, I said I support the idea of notification. I had problems with the Coordsen amendment. I think this makes it far more practical, would reserve the right to, after this is adopted, to revisit it maybe if there needed to be some modifications to it, but the concept of notification of the property owners makes some sense. I think what you're doing makes more sense, makes it more practical perhaps than the original Coordsen amendment. So I plan on supporting this. I'll probably support the full Coordsen amendment then, in that case, and just like I indicated earlier with Senator Chambers on an amendment of his that I adopted, if we find later that it causes undue burden on somebody or there's something we had not contemplated at this time, I would reserve the right to propose modifications to it at some future time, but at this time I will be voting for it.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Withem. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bromm, a question, if I may. I'm in the process of losing track of where we are on this particular amendment. But I'm concerned about this particular provision because, as I understand the eminent domain provision of this particular bill, it would apply not only to all private property but it would apply to all public property, to parks, to whatever may exist out there. And so I'm concerned about the notice provisions also and that everybody gets notice, the private owners as well as the public owners. The written notice, as it's now structured, as it would be structured if your amendment were adopted and then Senator Coordsen's amendment were adopted, would it also provide for...I...it would provide for written notice to all private entities within the project application area, for one thing. Right?

SENATOR BROMM: That would be correct, Senator Beutler.
