

in any way to be an obstruction or to cause problems for people to try to implement it if it becomes law. So I would suggest to the body and ask the body to go ahead and adopt the amendment. We'll continue to work on it. I think it's much better than having no notice requirement at all. To those people that live in the area or that own property in the area, I think we do need some notice and so, with that, I will close and ask the body to adopt the amendment to Senator Coordsen's amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Bromm. You've heard the close. The question is the adoption of the Bromm amendment to the Coordsen amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR HALL: The amendment to the amendment is adopted. Before we move back to the Coordsen amendment, I would like to announce a guest of Senator Bromm, who is under the south balcony, Curt Alexander from Dodge, Nebraska. Would you please rise and be recognized by the Legislature. Welcome to the Legislature. Mr. Clerk. Nothing further on the amendment. Senator Coordsen's amendment, as amended, the next light is Senator Chambers.
