

they will at least know what the elements are that they should be trying to deal with and include in the methodology of notice. So the only thing this amendment would do is reinstate the language about certified mail being a part of the notice process.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Withem, on the Chambers amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, Senator Hall, members of the body, I am not going to support the Chambers amendment. I think reading the word "certified" is a bit of a... is a bit of a burden. I think this is one of those times where what we're trying to do is not necessarily debate public policy, we're attempting to proofread an amendment and come up with the ultimate solution. I think the policy that most people agree with is that there ought to be some notification. That's policy statement number one. Policy statement number two, it ought not to be so burdensome as it would become impossible to carry out. And I'm beginning to think that although, obviously, Senator Coordsen is well within his rights to offer the amendment, Senator Chambers is well within his rights of attempting to amend it, that we're kind of reaching the point where better work could be done with three or four people sitting around a table, off the floor, attempting to come up with the right process for notification of these people rather than doing it here on the floor at this time. I'm becoming inclined, as just one individual senator with a vote on this, not to feel very comfortable supporting any of this change in notification and maybe waiting until we've had an opportunity to fully explore. Some things are done much better on the floor when we have serious policy disagreements, they tend to be resolved maybe better on the floor but when there's a general agreement, such as there appears to be in the general direction we want to go, I'm wondering if we're using our time as productively as possible. I'm not going to vote for the Chambers amendment and I'm becoming increasingly skeptical about the underlying Coordsen amendment but not with the concept of notification of property owners. We need to do that but we need to have a thorough way of doing that but also one that is not overly burdensome.
