

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I...I went through all of that because I know. as we get close to noon, Senator Withem becomes skeptical and maybe a little antsy, but they brought this kind of bill to us and although I'm not going to filibuster it, I'm not going to be stampeded into overlooking deficiencies in the bill and I wanted you to know that I'm not using your amendment just to delay. I'm serious about this and I think I'm more...

SENATOR HALL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...serious than they do. They want to ram something down people's throat. They don't want to protect the public and they think because they are irritated because they want to go to lunch and they've got some meeting that I'm going to overlook and forsake my responsibility. And I will say this, they can kill every bill that I've got, you can kill every bill I've got in committee, you can kill every bill I've got on this floor. You can threaten to do whatever you want to, but this bill is going to be discussed and if nobody else will do it, I shall, and you can tell it to the Governor, you can tell it to the Chamber and I will tell it to the Speaker because he's right here with us. And we can stay here till midnight if you all want to do it, but you ought to stop and consider how much you are going to allow your process, your process to be twisted out of shape, perverted in the interest of trying to get a company here who I tell you again is not going to come to Omaha.

SENATOR HALL: Time. Thank you, Senator Chambers. There being no other lights on the Chambers amendment to the Coordsen amendment...Mr. Clerk, is that accurate? No other lights, Senator Chambers, would you care to close on your amendment to the Coordsen amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. What this amendment does is to reinstate the requirement that certified mail be used in this process of notification. Now Senator Coordsen and Senator Bromm, who amended Senator Coordsen's amendment, have said they're willing to discuss this idea of notice further. Fine. But when they sit down in their negotiations I want them to know that there are some of us on the floor who have ideas, or at least one of us, as to how that notice should occur. And whatever you all agree to I'm not bound to accept that, and if you're going to make it convenient for these businesses and all of the big shots, everybody's so concerned about inconvenience to the big shot.
