

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to put that back into the amendment so that that can be a part of the negotiation. If everybody is acknowledging, everybody who has followed this discussion, that more work has to be done, what does it hurt to put this into the amendment? What does it hurt to make this a formal part of what is to be discussed? If it's not put there at all, then the ones who talk to the media can say again, well, it's obvious this was not wanted, it didn't get any votes, and that shows how strong the bill is. That's nonsense. I hope that you will agree to this amendment. And, Mr. Speaker, to hasten things, I will ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.
