PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. The question before the body is the adoption of the Coordsen amendment to LB 830. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: I ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote in regular order, please.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There has been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will all senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Will senators please check in. Senator Beutler, will you check in, please. Senator Pedersen, will you check in, please. Senator Robak, Senator Robinson and Senator Will. Senator Robinson. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See pages 811-12 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 18 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Coordsen amendment fails. I raise the call. Mr. Clerk, any further amendments?

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Coordsen. Senator, your amendment, page 6, line 20, after the word "corporation" strike "or joint venture".

SENATOR COORDSEN: I would like to pass over that for now, please.

CLERK: The next amendment I have to the bill, Senator Chambers, page 12, line 13, Senator, strike the period and add: "and if such area application is in the public interest." (Amendment appears on page 812 of the Legislative Journal.)
