

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Well, then, Senator Chambers, I do recognize you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, what I am going to do is try to rescue a portion of this language, so my amendment would except out subsection (5). Never have I seen such a perfect indictment of capitalism. Marx couldn't have done it better. Engels could not have done it better. Nobody in the communist world could have done it better, and were I able to sing, I would sing that song, Nobody Does It Better. Listen to what it says, talking about these bad conditions in a capitalistic society, these conditions are beyond remedy and control solely by regulatory process in the exercise of the police power, but this is the indictment, and cannot be dealt with effectively by the ordinary operations of private enterprise. Capitalism can't do the job. What is Newt saying at the federal level, private industry, private enterprise, let capitalism work, but capitalism cannot do it. Capitalism is a gun without bullets, a balloon without air. Capitalism is a sham and a hoax. Senator Jensen is sitting there voting for an indictment of capitalism. This language I want to stay in the bill, and I will echo with reference to this what Senator Hall had said about the other amendment that he attempted. Suppose I had put this language in a resolution, suppose I wanted to get the Legislature to adopt this, and to say that if you leave it to private enterprise, these problems cannot be solved, therefore, the state has to do it. What has communism always said, what has socialism always said? You cannot rely on an exploitive capitalistic system to produce the goods that society needs. Yes, Senator Jensen, yes, I am condemning capitalism, but I am only doing it because I am reading it in a proposal brought by the Chamber of Commerce. Those who know best made a Freudian slip and told the truth after all of this posturing, all of this strutting, all of this meddling in the business of every other country around the globe, we finally have the truth being spoken, and the little pinhead State of Nebraska. Why do I call it pinhead? You don't have any population growth. You have an out-migration. Nobody wants to stay here. Everybody is leaving. You don't have decent jobs. You don't have decent housing. You have no morals. What else do you not have? I love this. This is like Christmas in February to me. I hope we can do this every night, every night of the session. You have no public health. You have no public safety. As Senator Hall said, we know you have no morals because this venture typified by this bill is immoral.
