The other provision in Section 2 is subsection 2. There exists in the urban and rural areas of the state an inadequate supply of and a pressing need for safe, sanitary and uncrowded housing available to low and moderate income families and persons, including but not limited to persons displaced by clearing of slums and blighted areas or other public programs. Well, that may be true but it doesn't have anything to do with this bill. This bill is about a factory. It isn't about any low income housing, in fact, it doesn't authorize anyone to develop low income housing and get any of the benefits from the bill. Why is it in there? There is absolutely nothing, nothing...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...in the operative provisions of this bill about low income housing. You couldn't build a low income house with the provisions of this bill. If you did, you wouldn't get any credits. Does that give you folks any idea how silly and ridiculous some of the provisions in this section are? Senator Hall has been urging you to read them and, in fact, has been reading them to you. I don't know how many more opportunities we will have to read to you or to suggest how silly these things are and what you will be voting for if you vote for them. But, certainly, if you don't read them tonight, read them sometime so that you can explain to people how building a factory has...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...anything at all to do with low income housing.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Madam President, members of the body, as several speakers before, I think to use this opportunity to speak to the Hall amendment and the bill might be appropriate. I certainly don't feel that the Chambers amendment has any more value than the rest of Section 2. It's totally unnecessary. It has no place in the statute books of the State of Nebraska. It indicates that there are many, far too many members of this body who have not read, they have simply agreed with whoever talked to them, yea, yea, this is what we shall do. Maybe the bill
