SPEAKER WITHEM: I would ask for a call of the house.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There has been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will all senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Will senators please check in. Senator Avery, will you check in, please. Senator Elmer, Senator Lynch, Senator McKenzie, will you check in, please. Senator Jones, will you check in, please. Senator Janssen. Senator Lynch. The question before the body is the cloture vote. The cloture vote takes 33 votes. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Withem. There has been a request for a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 814-15 of the Legislative Journal.) 33 ayes, 9 nays on the motion to invoke cloture.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Cloture is invoked. We turn now to a vote on the Chambers amendment to the Hall amendment to LB 830. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 5 ayes, 26 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the amendment to the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chambers amendment to the Hall amendment to LB 830 fails. We now vote on the Hall amendment to LB 830. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 23 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The amendment fails. We now vote on the advancement of LB 830. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.
