

February 21, 1995 LB 829, 830

CLERK: 30 ayes, 12 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 830.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 830 advances. I raise the call. Mr. Clerk, any items for the record?

CLERK: I have nothing at this time, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: I would move that we adjourn until eight-thirty tomorrow morning.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All those in favor say aye. Excuse me, Senator Withem, we have another motion on the floor. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to recess until 9:30 p.m.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: I would raise the point of order that I believe the vote was called on the motion to adjourn originally, although if the purpose of Senator Chambers' motion is to keep us in session longer, I'm certainly willing to do that, so I will withdraw the objection to the point.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Withem. The question before the body is on the motion to recess. All those in favor say aye. There's been a request for a machine vote. All those in favor of the motion to recess vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 4 ayes, 22 nays on the motion to recess.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: We do not recess. We turn now to LB 829.

ASSISTANT CLERK: LB 829 was introduced by Senators Withem, Abboud, Avery, Brashear, Brown, Jensen, Pirsch and Wehrbein. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 19th of this year, referred to the Revenue Committee. That committee reported the bill to General File with committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner to open on the committee amendments.
