

sure that's really what they're looking for. They're looking for a little greater return on investment than that. So our state ought to be thinking along the lines of a business here and saying what kind of return investment do we make. Well, part of our return on investment is the jobs created have income, that income is taxed and that helps us return revenues into the State of Nebraska. That's..

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR WESELY: ...that's where we come out ahead on these deals. That's exactly what goes away with what is being proposed with LB 829. So the one aspect of the previous bills that we passed that were positive, in a sense, to the equation of whether we gain or lose from the proposals is now being taken away by this bill. Now, again, it only applies to 500 companies and to \$50 million, so it's not to everybody out there that would qualify for 775. I'm not trying to argue that, but I am saying it's the next step and then what will be the next step after that, and that next step, in a sense, was taken with the Warner amendment, and we'll see further steps be taken in the future. Anyway, I hope we can talk some more about the bottom line impact on this bill before it's advanced and what it will ultimately cost the people of the State of Nebraska and how we might refine it better. These things are coming at us so fast without the time to read and be prepared and deal with these issues. I apologize for not having had the chance to work on further amendments, and, obviously, with only a few days here coming, how can we possibly, totally have the chance to work through...

SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR WESELY: ...these. But, nevertheless, I think talking about them and trying to talk through the issues is important.
