

probably a larger number of people outside of the body, have been asking questions about how they should be planning for the next few days of debate, assuming that the body follows the recommendations that I put forth as I make the agenda. It is very difficult to do that with any degree of certainty because we do not know what will be happening with these various pieces of legislation. So what I've done is I've laid out three different options, and I would point out to you that there is a fourth option. Obviously, the fourth option is that the Legislature chooses not to pass any of these three pieces of legislation, but kind of one of the underlying assumptions of all three of these scenarios is that we eventually will move to Final Reading votes on all three of the bills. Scenario 1 would be one where the LB 830, which you see on your board right now, would be debated, would be amended, would be discussed, would be massaged, and would ultimately advance this evening. If that happens, then tomorrow's schedule will be a lay-over of LB 830, a discussion on LB 829, and hopefully a vote to advance it to E & R Final, and a vote to advance LB 828, and both in the morning from E & R...to E & R Initial and then E & R Final later on in the evening. Friday, then, we'd be able to debate LB 830 and we'd be able to have LB 828 and LB 829 lay over, reconvene on Monday, and then we would be through with this package on Monday by passing or not passing LB 828 and LB 829 on Final Reading. Scenario 2 would be one, kind of a middle-ground scenario, where LB 828 and LB 829 remain, I use the term, fairly noncontroversial, because that was the characterization I got from them, from the flavor of the debate this morning, but that LB 830 is the bill that continues to be contentious, and we move...we have to move through eight hours of debate on Select File and move to cloture. If that were to happen, we would debate LB 830 I put the term five hours; it is, of course, dependent upon how long the body wants to stay and how long we want to debate, but that LB 830 would not advance tonight. Then we'd be back on Thursday morning dealing with LB 830 and going as long as we need to either advancing it or invoking cloture, and then trying during the evening to advance LB 828 over to E & R Initial, and LB 829 to E & R Final. Then Friday would be the layover day for LB 830 and LB 829, and we would debate LB 828 onto E & R Initial...Final, and perhaps also debate some other legislation on General File. That is not on the memo. We come back on Monday and do Final Reading on LB 830 and LB 829. LB 828 would lay over, and then LB 828 would be the Final Reading on Tuesday. The final scenario would be one where all three bills are very contentious and there is a full, I used the
