So in other words, there is no way of accurately predicting exactly what will happen with the schedule, but this lays out the options that will be available to the Legislature based on what happens with legislation this evening and tomorrow morning. If you have any questions about this, I'd be happy to address those off the mike, but thank you, Madam President, for the opportunity to address these issues.

I might indicate to the members that they will find on their desk AM7047, which are the E & R amendments, which is essentially a rewrite, so that should be the version you will be working from tonight, AM7047. SENATOR MAURSTAD: Madam President, I would move to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 830.
