

SENATOR COORDSEN: Um-hma.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...but the reason I asked is that what, and is to get your intent of what we are notifying them of, that they are being involved in this process, that there isn't...there isn't a particular meeting or something that they are being notified of, is that...

SENATOR COORDSEN: No, that would be...my interpretation of the language would be as you state. The notice states that the property owned by the person or persons is proposed to be included in a project area of a project under the Nebraska Redevelopment Act, that the project application has been filed with the city or joint entity, and where additional information may be obtained.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR COORDSEN: And by the way, I have my light on too if we run out of time.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay, I think that that is important for me because of what we want to accomplish with the notice, and I don't know if Senator Chambers was listening, but in an attempt to try to help him with that notice provision, this is an attempt to give notice in two manners to a group of people that they are involved in this project, one of them being through a constructive process through a legal notice. I've got to tell you that legal notices probably aren't...if you want to give actual notice through a legal notice, it isn't going to happen. But it does occur in a constructive manner, and to the extent that some people may see that and wonder about it, it does help. But the more important notice provision is the actual notice being sent to landowners that are ascertainable and I assume they will ascertain that, and the amendment has here that they are going to go up to the clerk's office or wherever, ascertain who those landowners are, and send notice, and I assume that that...

SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...would be...we will continue this discussion, Senator Coordsen, because I've got something I want
