

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There's been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 39 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will senators please return to your seats. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senators, please check in. Senator Fisher, will you check in, please. Roll call vote, please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 841 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 22 nays on the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The amendment fails. Items for the record. I raise the call.

CLERK: Madam President, Business and Labor Committee reports LB 365, LB 382, LB 504 to General File. Senator McKenzie has selected LB 377 as her priority bill. Senator Wesely, amendments to be printed to LB 829. (See pages 841-42 of the Legislative Journal.)

Madam President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Chambers. Senator, I have a note you wish to withdraw this and substitute.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Madam President, members of the Legislature, I'm going to withdraw that amendment and substitute the one which is on the Clerk's desk.
