

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...growth in certain areas and are beyond remedy solely by the normal regulatory process and the ordinary operations of private enterprise. That would mean that we're going to put in place extraordinary measures relative to private enterprise so that it can then deal with these matters. Would you agree with that? If the ordinary operations won't work, the purpose of this bill is to put extraordinary something in conjunction with private enterprise so that it can work. Would you agree with that?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Essentially, yes, Senator. We are going to "incentivise" and enhance the process because it hasn't happened yet.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, now do you think that all these provisions and I know you're going to support the...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, Madam President, I'll try to be brief because it is getting to be late. In principle I agree with what Senator Chambers is saying because I did offer the amendment to strike the provisions that are being discussed in good faith. I think they are simply clutter, they are inappropriate, they are not going to be dealt with in the court in the manner in which the authors intended them to do. I think they'll make us look silly. They might have a better positioning as Senator Chambers is suggesting, but I'm not sure that that can be worked out this evening. But I would be happy
