fashion than we originally had by doing away with the whole act or it appears that that language we adopted could have done that. It may jeopardize some of the status of some of the projects and so this, again, the intent is clear I think that there is a sunset on this. It ends February 1, year 2000. Prior to that if you have an application in it's possible to move forward on it. If you have an application approved it will be fulfilled, but you aren't going to add on to the exemptions any further beyond that date, and with that understanding and that intent, I can live with the amendment and it does clarify what we adopted earlier, I do support the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Discussion on the Kristensen amendment, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President and members, the amendment, Senator Kristensen, is it 597? Doug.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes, it is, the substance of it is, yes. What I did is I did a little handwriting because it was an amendment to the amendment, but all the substantive language is 597, yes.

SENATOR HALL: So we're talking about Section 33 as it's found on page 41 of the amendment.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: As it is in Senator Withem's...or Senator Wesely's amendment that he had prior, yes.

SENATOR HALL: Well, my question is, I guess, we're dealing with...we're amending AM7047, right?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR HALL: And Section 33 is found on page 41 of that, correct?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I don't have that reference, but I assume...let me grab it, I assume it is, Senator, yes.

SENATOR HALL: Okay, take the time, I mean...in no hurry, we're not going home yet. The...so we strike Section 33 that says February 1, 1997.
