

scenario one on the list that I gave you. If we don't, we're operating on scenario two and scenario three. It's the decision of the body. This is somewhat of a...this is a debatable motion unlike the cloture motion so people have an opportunity to voice their opinion as to whether this is a good procedure or not a good procedure. The body can certainly make up its own mind. One thought I would like to express though, and I was thinking about this a little earlier on and I know that there are some frustrations here that come back, is a force outside of the body putting undue pressure on us to act? The answer is yes, they certainly are and I think everybody is aware of that. The question is, how do we respond? I think by now a majority of us have come to the conclusion that we have a fairly good product here, we have two other relatively good products in that the proper public policy is to give a response to this company that would like to locate here because of its potential impact on our citizens. I'd like you though to contrast what this Legislature has done with what would have happened in other states. Senator Elmer, earlier, was telling me of an anecdote that he'd heard from a friend in Idaho, and I hope it's accurate the way he got the story, that the gentleman from this company appeared before the Legislature yesterday complaining, day before yesterday, complaining because they had not responded to his concerns about a college of engineering. The day later the Legislature responded to that. In most state legislatures if you have a governor, a powerful lobby, and the legislative leadership supporting a position, it happens literally overnight. Both houses vote on it, very little debate and you get legislation with lots of warts in it. Our system is one despite the fact that we may have liked to have done that, we've had extended debate on this bill, we've cleaned up a lot of things, we've accommodated a lot of concerns that are out there and we have a much better product for it. This sort of process we've gone through is one that despite the fact that I'm very tired and my nerves are frazzled and almost lost my cool a couple of times, and may yet treat you to that as...before the process goes much further, in essence, what we have done is we've worked our way through a process. Do we have a perfect product here? Obviously not. Very few bills that go through here are, in fact, perfect. But I think we've done a good job of addressing a lot of the concerns that the minority of membership has had on this. We've dealt with the intent language, we've dealt with notification, we've dealt with and I can't even remember all the other things we've dealt with. I think now though is the time where we ought to say we've done as good a job as we're going to
