SPEAKER WITHEM: Question.

SENATOR CROSBY: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor please vote aye and a roll call vote has been requested. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See pages 846-47 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 7 nays. We're not under call.

SENATOR CROSBY: The motion to call the question fails. We are back to the discussion on suspension of the rules. Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Madam Chairperson. Senator Hall, would you yield to a question, please?

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Hall.

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Hall, I checked a little while ago and there were two amendments pending and I believe they were both yours, and if given the chance, I assume from your prior statements you wish to take them up. Is that correct?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Bromm, earlier, and I'm not sure if you were on the floor or not, I put up a motion to adjourn around 10 o'clock...whatever it was, whenever we had four hours, just over four hours of debate in, nine fifty-two I guess it was, because I was ready to go home. That was fine with me. I did not want to delay the effort. I figured that we're looking at four hours of debate on this issue tomorrow and then the cloture motion being put into place.

SENATOR BROMM: I guess my question goes...

SENATOR HALL: The answer is yes though to your question.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. My question was really, are these amendments that you really want to discuss? I guess I assume they are.
