

February 22, 1995 LB 829, 830

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. Senator Withem, would you like to check in? There's been a request for a roll call vote. The question is to Senator Withem's motion to suspend the rules. Mr. Clerk, would you please call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See pages 847-48 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 12 nays on the motion to suspend the rules, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, the motion carries. The motion is adopted. We are now prepared to vote on the advancement of LB 830 to E & R engrossing. The question is, shall the bill be advanced to E & R engrossing? All in favor say aye...machine vote has been requested. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 6 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 830.

SENATOR CROSBY: LB 830 advances.

CLERK: I have one item to read in, if I may, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Do you have items for the record?

CLERK: Senator Wesely, amendments to LB 829 to be printed. (Wesely amendment appears on page 848 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CROSBY: I'll raise the call. Speaker Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, just to facilitate the business of the body, if we could wait to make the adjournment motion until after the bill is reported back down, it would be helpful. Obviously, the body can make motions, do as they please. My recommendation would be that we stand at ease and there's not a great need for everybody to stick around to do that necessarily, but that would be my recommendation.

SENATOR CROSBY: We'll stand at ease.
