

February 23, 1995 LB 828, 829, 830

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't want you to spill any water on yourself as you carry it this morning, but you're the only one available to whom I can ask these questions. Are you familiar with the terms of LB 828?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I've read LB 828, I'm not a big...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't mean as an expert, but...

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...you're generally familiar with them.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Yes, I'm familiar with the terms.

SENATOR LINDSAY: My understanding that it's part of the package that's been developed by the Governor, Nebraska Department of Economic Development, the Chamber of Commerce, those who are working to try to get the project here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is it your opinion that if Micron...if Micron project were not looming on the horizon this bill would be before us?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I guess I would concur, I think it was Senator Beutler's comment that I don't know that it would be here today, but I think at some point in the future it probably would be.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If Micron doesn't come and those of you all who supported this, LB 829 and LB 830, and it's been acknowledged even by the Speaker that 830 is not a perfect project, will you help undo the damage that is being done in this haste?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Yeah, if there's things that need to be cleaned up in any of the bills, yes, I would be willing to help clean up any of that language to try to make them better bills
