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the project? Do you think that's an issue that some people might want to discuss and have clarification on?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was that ever discussed during...during our floor debate?

SENATOR LINDSAY: During debate, no. I don't think so, not that I'm aware of.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it cannot be discussed based on where we are now, wouldn't you agree?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Probably not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And I appreciate that. I hate it I had to ask but the Speaker is not talking to me this morning. Members of the Legislature, there are serious issues in this bill that need to be discussed, not necessarily to be amended. If I see something in one of these bills that I think is not appropriate, I will ask questions. If the questions are...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...answered satisfactorily and I can see the validity of it, there's no need to offer an amendment. We discuss and argue bills because we're trying to formulate and shape policy. And when I hear people stand on this floor and continue to talk about a competitive environment in which the states are functioning and trying to draw these companies, and I can see where a county has anted up \$200,000, it's legitimate to ask should Nebraska do the same thing since you're trying to meet everything they do. But you get offended at that. But you're giving up everything else. One way or the other the bills have to be discussed and they will be discussed until we reach the end of the line.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President and members. Senator Beutler, would you respond to a question.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Beutler.
