

and benefits. And they're a good corporate citizen and you can expect it, you can count on it, it's going to be there. I say put it in the statute, because some...that same promise was made with LB 775 and you know some of it was fulfilled and I was grateful for that, but some of it wasn't. Had we put something like this into the statute, we would have ended up with a much better picture in terms of the lost revenue and the jobs created would have been much more attractive than the ones that ended up being created. And I think that, in the end, we have a much more positive result from this legislation if you adopt the amendment. Again, the amendment says \$11 wages and benefits, you get the tax credit.

SENATOR LANDIS: Time, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: If you have less than that, you can have the jobs, that's great, but you don't get the tax credit. I ask your support for the amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you very much. The house is under call. Can we proceed with the vote, Senator Wesely? Thank you. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk. It's a record vote, please.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 859-60 of the Legislative Journal.) 10 ayes, 20 nays on the amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR LANDIS: The amendment is defeated. The call is raised. Senator Crosby will be taking the Chair. Mr. Clerk, the next item of business, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely has the next amendment. Senator, I have a note you want to withdraw this one. This is AM598 that you had had printed. Sunset date, I believe. Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Wickersham. Senator, this is AM602.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. Clerk, I would like to substitute AM632. (The Wickersham amendment appears on pages 360-61 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR LANDIS: Is there any objection to the substitution? Hearing none, it is so ordered. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wickersham would offer AM632.
