

to redress what was arguably an error in the original start of this bill. Certainly, I believe that option number one is the policy option that is appropriate for us. It is the one that ensures that 1059 is not affected. It is the one that ensures that school districts across the State of Nebraska won't make up for the economic development credits that we give to some plant, and there is that potential as the bill now stands. Now, I hope that is enough explanation. I know that you're probably struggling to read the language. I don't know how to address you properly other than to explain to you in this rather brief fashion what it does. If it generates, as I've noted before, specific questions about how it does that, I will be happy to try to respond.

SENATOR CROSBY PRESIDING

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. Discussion on the Wickersham amendment, Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Madam Chairman, members, I rise in support of the Wickersham amendment. As we, Senator Wickersham and I, had a disagreement, I guess, earlier on on this issue and what direction we should take concerning what I have called the Micron schools, and recognizing other options that were before us at that time, I would say now we do have the option before us for those agreements in the future and recognizing that in the best case scenario the 80/20 would have been that best case. And I agree with that. I think it's the correct philosophy and so into the future I think that that's the direction we should move and I support the Wickersham amendment.
