CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment, Senator Chambers, you have the next amendment. Senator, I have a note you want to withdraw this...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

CLERK: ...and offer the, I believe it was the last amendment you gave me. (Chambers amendment, FA66, appears on page 864 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, that's correct. Members of the Legislature, you have a copy of this amendment coming around to you. What it would do, if you want to follow as I read it for you, is amend line 3 on page 6. If you have any questions, I'll be glad to answer them. The second part amends line 27 on page 11. I have talked to Senator Withem about this and we have agreed, so I won't take a lot of time. If you have any questions about any aspect of it or the reason for it, I'll be glad to answer those questions.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any discussion of the Chambers amendment? Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, Senator Chambers did in fact show these to me, and I believe I'm losing my sense of exactly what the provisions do, but it's a language cleanup and to make things clearer. I believe one of them, the...okay, it's coming back to me. The first one was in reference to what the employee benefit may be, wage benefit may be spent on. There is one reading which was frankly both Senator Chambers and my first reading of that section that made it look like the employer and the employee could agree to any wide-ranging sort of activities on which this money could be spent. Checking with the drafters of it, that was not the intent. I think the amendment, page 6, line 3 makes that clearer. And in the second one we're talking about a...a...an audit, I believe by the Department of Revenue, of some provision of this bill. The original language made it
