PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is there any discussion on the motion to suspend the rules? Seeing none, the question before you is whether we should suspend the rules regarding LB 830. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: We'll be going under call anyway when we get Final Reading. So I would request a call of the house and I would accept call-in votes.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you. There has been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will all senators please return to your seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senators, please check in. We are accepting call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Elmer voting yes. Senator Lynch, you had voted yes, Senator.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Robak, Senator Preister, Senator Hudkins. There is a motion to suspend the rules before you. We are accepting call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Beutler voting yes. Senator Matzke voting yes.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays to suspend the rules to permit consideration of LB 830 on Final Reading, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The rules will be suspended. We will hear LB 830 on Final Reading.

CLERK: Madam President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator...the first motion I have is with respect to Senator...or from Senator Hall, I should say. Senator Hall is excused until he arrives.
