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that I have an interest greater than this in trying to restructure the tax policy of this state to what I think would be a fair and more equitable policy in years to come than where we are now and I'm not just talking about farmers. I think you know that the homeowners in your districts are not happy. They're not happy with the property tax situation. If you don't know that, then you haven't been home lately. And that is paramount in my mind and if we can do this in a week or ten days or whatever we've been at this, we can change the tax policy of this state to where it is more palatable and more equitable for people whether it be the homeowner, the farmer and don't tell me we can't and if we pass this bill, I am going to absolutely insist that we turn our attention to tax policy because we can do it. Don't tell me it's too complicated, it's too confusing because we've done this in a very short period of time, so we can do it. Now, with that in mind, if we don't get Micron, I do not want to take the chance that people...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...will say, you didn't help us with Micron so why should we pay any attention to tax policy? Why should we try and help the rest of the state? So I can tell you I don't know if it's the best policy in the world and we'll probably be back amending it some day and maybe repealing it if Micron doesn't come, I don't know. But weighing all of this, I'm going to give Micron a chance to come here, but I commit to you that as far as my feet, they will be to the fire in looking at the tax structure of the state for the rest of this session. And I ask those of you who are sincere about that to join in that effort because we can do it if we set our minds to it. This proves that we can. And if the Speaker needs to schedule night sessions and start at eight-thirty to do it, I think he should do it. I think...

SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR BROMM: ...it's that important. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, my discussion is not for the purpose of defeating the bill because that is not going to happen, but there are issues that
