

off my debt with the taxes I otherwise would owe, I could grow like everything. Everybody else could too. I could live in a lot bigger house I suppose or whatever. But that policy bothers me. When we started this whole thing I was looking for a way to rationalize doing something that I don't believe in as a matter of policy but under the circumstances maybe was right.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR WARNER: But as it now stands I'm going to vote no for the reasons of policy and actually I suppose I would hope the Legislature probably passes it. I don't want us to be held responsible for Micron but on the other hand neither do I want us to violate, at least personally I'm not going to violate what I traditionally thought was better public policy, so...

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Madam President, I'm just going to make a couple of comments and then I'm going to yield the balance of time to Senator Chambers. I...Senator Bromm brought up earlier this morning the question of revisiting the issue to clean up or do whatever to make what I think a lot of people think is not a perfect product, and I think Senator Withem mentioned that this is not a perfect product. And, yes, we may need to revisit it to clean that up and I have made that commitment already in discussions with Senator Chambers earlier. I make the same thing publicly and I think Senator Bromm, his position, I would concur with it. I think we do need to make sure that the policy is in the form that we want it. The bottom line is though, we're not dealing in a vacuum. We have deadlines. Most of us would prefer not to have that deadline out there. We'd like the luxury of having all the time that we need to craft it, a perfect product. We don't have that. We have to play with the cards that were dealt to us, so I would urge that the bill be advanced with the E clause but I would also commit to working on this in the future. With that I yield the balance of the time to Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Chambers, you have a little more than three minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Madam President, the reason that I am going to speak again now, Senator Beutler's amendment had already been adopted so it's not up there and the reason I'm
