If you see things that are genuine problems, you know, not necessarily revisiting the policy, if you see things that are genuine problems and Urban Affairs Committee bills going through to which a germane amendment would be in place, you betcha, it makes a lot of sense.

SENATOR WESELY: Well that...that...and I appreciate the...and I know you have said that, I praise the fact that you have been willing to look at amendments and have been willing to look at this, but again the concern is there that having had the previous experience, and I think at that time we talked about yeah, you know, we will take care of problems later but it never happened and so again it is an imaginable line argument that has some of us concerned and I was just hoping to divert us off the last topic so I was actually trying to be constructive and I'm sorry I wasn't.
