Members of the Legislature, this is the last time I will speak on this bill, but I really see a couple of things that are troubling to me if I were in a position, or if it were my legislation to try to do something with it. But there has been discussion about trying to clean up some of these bills by way of other bills and maybe that can be done. But keep in mind, an operating farm...
