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won't hold you on the mike now because the time is up, and I said that other time was the last speaking I'd have, but I wanted to raise the question, and I will review that with you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wickersham, your light is next.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Madam President. I will be brief. Mrs. Moul, the Director of the Department of Economic Development, did have a brief conversation with me behind the Chamber, advised me that they are...the anticipation from that department anyway is that, indeed, there will be an executive recommendation formulated for the board meeting, but neither she nor anyone else in the administration at this point, at least as I understand her to say, has any knowledge of what that recommendation might be, or if one has already been formulated. As to the question of whether or not the company might be eligible for other benefits, of course, 775 benefits are well-known. Senator Warner last year had a bill for job training with a six million dollar pot in it for companies with more than 750 employees, it would be eligible for that. With some regret in her voice, Mrs. Moul indicated that her budget in the Department of Economic Development was not large enough to provide any significant benefits for projects of this type, and so she wasn't really aware of anything else that the company might be able to receive. I'm sure she will be taking up with the Appropriations Committee later whether or not her budget should be larger so she has discretionary funds for these kinds of projects. But at any rate, apparently we do not know yet, or have any good indication of whether or not Nebraska will be selected, and perhaps we do see all that is on the table for Micron.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Withem. There is no further lights. Senator Withem, do you wish to close?

SPEAKER WITHEM: I would just very quickly, just to respond to a couple of things that were stated here. The one thing that I may or may not have been clear on, Senator Wickersham's remarks or his discussion with Maxine Moul, that there was, Senator Wickersham, I think I've alluded to this a number of times, a package that went in. It is not just three bills. There is a whole bunch of other stuff. I do not know of anything else in that package, though, that would constitute a new commitment on the part of Nebraska that has not already specifically been
