Secondly, Senator Chambers, with his dialogus with Senator Kristensen, talked about what might be able to take place in one of these areas, whether or not we could have a corporate, corporate operation of a farmstead that had been declared blighted and substandard. I do not, the way I read Section 22 of the bill, LB 829, which I believe the identical language was in LB 830, there are certain types of businesses that qualify and some that do not. For instance, retail does not qualify, and I don't believe operation of a farm would. Whether or not a packing plant would, I, quite frankly, as I read this language, cannot tell you whether that definition falls within this bill or does not. With that, I thank everybody again for their discussion on this legislation. I would withdraw this motion.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Withem. The motion is withdrawn. Returns us now to Final Reading of LB 829E. Will senators please return to your seats, we are on Final Reading. Senators, please return to your seats. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 829 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Withem.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Will all senators please check in. The house is under call, will all senators please check in. Senator Janssen, will you check in, please. Senator Avery, will you check in, please. Senator Matzke, will you check in, please. Senator Lynch, will you check in, please. There has been a request for a roll call vote. Please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 906-907 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 13 nays on the final passage with the emergency clause attached.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 829 does not pass with the emergency clause. The question before you now is, shall the bill pass
