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Douglas County almost a thousand people from all across the state, I want senators to know that people come from all across the state to these meetings in Omaha because this issue is something that they feel needs to be discussed at all levels of government, and it does so. And, Senator Kristensen, you're right, it is intracounty in Douglas County but it is in also several other counties that we have a problem. And, the Board of Equalization right now, as I understand it, is looking into repealing the 10 percent that they just put in on the valuation change because we were at inequitable...and I said this to the Governor and to the revenue people at the time, if you have things inequitable and you raised everything 10 percent or 20 percent, they're still inequitable. So we do have some problems with the board right now. We have some problems in Douglas County right now and this...this law is not going to change...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR WITEK: ...any of those problems that we're having. What it is, is going to insert a whole other area of whether the Legislature needs to be involved in this, needs to be setting any range at all, not just this range but any range at all, so it's a much broader issue and I hope, I sincerely hope that senators are doing their best to understand it, to see that it is not a Douglas County or any of the other counties that have problems, our problem only, it is...we're changing the policy, we're changing...we're inserting ourselves in that area of the Constitution without changing the Constitution, which I think will be unconstitutional, and then we're saying we're the ones who are going to start setting the range because nobody else is doing their job, because we're going to come in and do it for them. That's a huge policy change. We need to have a better, more thorough discussion about that instead of just passing this in...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR WITEK: ...and...and allowing no accountability with the State Board of Equalization. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Witek. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Question.
