Madam President, I would ask for the rule suspension in order that the amendment can be taken up.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is there any discussion of the motion to suspend the rules? Seeing none, the question before you is the Warner amendment to suspend the rules. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. The motion is to suspend the rules. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the motion to suspend the germaneness rule.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The rules are suspended.

CLERK: Senator Warner offers AM0691, Madam President. (AM0691 appears on pages 930-31 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Again, Madam President, this amendment that is being offered would permit the Secretary of State to make refunds to those who have paid their corporate occupation tax prior to being notified that the wrong fee schedule went out sometime in December. To give you an idea of the amount of overpayment, depending upon what the paid-up capital stock, would range from \$30 to as much as \$240, depending on the size of the corporation, but, nevertheless, the Secretary of State needed the authorization to make the refund. They, obviously, have the money to do it with because it was overpaid, but I would move adoption of the amendment so that this can be done.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Warner. Is there any discussion of the Warner amendment? Seeing none, Senator Warner, do you wish to close? Closing is waived. The question before you is the adoption of the Warner amendment to LB 182. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Warner amendment is adopted.
