

caseworker, foster parent or other other custodians, not necessarily all that had been involved with the juvenile going back for a long time into the past. So the mandatory contact is limited to the most current caseworker but that doesn't mean as the rest of the bill suggests that there may not be contact with these other caseworkers along with a number of other people who are outlined in the bill. So all it does is limit the mandatory contact in that one category to the most current caseworker, and I would yield the rest of my time to Senator Vrtiska.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Madam President, members of the body, I support the amendment that Senator Beutler brought forward. I think it helps the bill and I think it does what we want to do and still helps provide some containment of costs and, therefore, I support his amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Your light is on next, do you wish to speak again? Senator Beutler, there are no further lights, do you wish to close? Closing is waived. The question before the body is the adoption of the Beutler amendment to LB 305. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

SENATOR HALL PRESIDING

SENATOR HALL: Have you all voted? We're voting on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment to LB 305. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

SENATOR HALL: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Maurstad, on the bill.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. President, I would move to advance LB 305 and call for a record vote.
