them on the books and then we can have the option to do what we wish as a Legislature. So I oppose the 'very amendment and I support the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. The Chair recognizes Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, Madam President, members of the body, I'm going to make a motion to adjourn until tomorrow morning at nine, but I want to take an opportunity to visit a little bit about scheduling for the rest of the week. One of the things that we did during the last couple of weeks, one of the things that did get backed up was the types of motions that are not related to the passing of legislation. We'll be dealing with those tomorrow. I believe there are a number of resolutions pending that will be on the agenda, two of them a little more significant than your typical resolutions. One will be the Commission on the States resolution will be held tomorrow. The other one will be Senator Jones dealing with the 10th Amendment. Both of those will be scheduled tomorrow. Thursday of this week we will begin those individual senator priority bills that are ready for debate. At this point I know of one. The latest member of our middle-aged group will be having her priority bill heard on Thursday of this week. That's what the rest of the week will be looking like. Other time we have available we'll probably continue on this General File list. With that, I would move that we adjourn...the other point I guess, one of the reasons I wanted to speak and I almost forgot to do that, to remind the body that our Staff Director for the National Conference of State Legislatures is with us this morning. There is a luncheon scheduled at the Hruska Building. Would urge those of you that have...were wondering whether to go or not to go, to go to that I think it would be valuable, particularly in light of this discussion we've had here on this bill and we can continue that discussion about the relevance of some of these national organizations we belong to, so I would urge you to try to make it to that meeting. With that, I would move to adjourn until 9:00 a.m., Wednesday, March 1.
