

fiscal note on this. We have no idea at this time, at least, unless some senators answer where we are getting the money from to do this, I imagine it must be coming from the Conference of State Governments or someone, I don't know. But we will have one shot and one shot only to vote for or against this resolution in the State of Nebraska, and I have received more, more calls, more information on this alone in my office. And it was...I was not even aware of this until I heard it in the Executive Board Committee, and I guess what alarmed me was Senator Kristensen has been in the Government Committee for at least the two years that I have been on it calling for a constitutional convention, with a bill to call for a constitutional convention, and the bill was killed in committee those years. The feelings of the Government Committee being that we did not need a constitutional convention, we do not want to change the Constitution. I, myself, just want to see it used and used correctly, as Senator Chambers said. But that bill was killed in our committee. Then this year comes this proposal in the form of a resolution. It goes in front of the Executive Board, comes out on the floor of the Legislature of the State of Nebraska. We get one opportunity to pass or not pass this, and that is this morning, so I hope everybody is paying attention, unless this discussion goes into another day. This...this Conference of State Governments, I have been collecting information on it, and will try to share as much of it with you as I can. But I wanted to ask in particular, Senator Kristensen, what's to stop the convention once...or the conference once they get there from calling on Congress to convene a constitutional convention. As I can see it, there is nothing stopping that. So you, as soon you get all these people here and you'll have all the states because you say it is thirty-four states have to ratify, which is the same amount that you need for a constitutional convention, as I understand it, you can go walk into this building and call for a constitutional convention from Congress, receive that from Congress, and then immediately start the proceedings as a constitutional convention. It has to be telling that individuals who in previous years have called for a constitutional convention, and been unsuccessful, are the same individuals that are coming in this year with a Conference of States proposal. I hope people realize that that's part of it, and also that there is no fiscal note on this. Where is the money come...who is funding this whole conference, and why? And as Senator Chambers said, and I couldn't agree more, it would be much better to come forward and admit that this is what they intend to do. I have plenty of
