PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Abboud.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Abboud, this is what Senator Witek's amendment says, adoption of this resolution does not constitute an application by the Legislature of Nebraska for the calling of a federal constitutional convention, within the meaning of Article V of the Constitution of the United States. How does that differ from what you said Senator Kristensen is offering as an amendment?

SENATOR ABOUD: I think that's the exact language of Senator Kristensen's amendment (interruption)...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, are you a...are you a...

SENATOR ABOUD: ...which was...you just quoted to me.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...are you a sexist?

SENATOR ABOUD: No, of course not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you a chauvinist? Certainly not. Are you partial to Senator Kristensen over Senator Witek? Certainly not. In order for us not to have to go through a second step to get to where we can go with this one step, will you now support Senator Witek's amendment since I've read to you what it actually says?

SENATOR ABOUD: Well, on that, Senator Witek's amendment, what's the number on that, maybe we are...is that AM0700?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: AM0723.

SENATOR ABOUD: Well, I will support that amendment, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Senator Witek, do you see what a job I did of garnering some support for your amendment. I didn't just get somebody who was sitting on the fence, somebody who was leaning in your direction, but somebody who was opposed
