

the extra added price that we get out of corn. And I'm familiar with just one of the plants in the state and that's the plant at Blair and I've watched this plant grow as Senator Robinson has, and he's always kept me informed of what is happening over there. But I know that their plan is to keep adding onto this plant for the next ten years. And at the present time there are around a thousand, 1,100 laborers that are working on that plant and they are working on it practically night and day because they want to have this plant operating by the end of this month. And I know that they are hiring some of our technical people to work on this plant and as the plant grows, we will be having more and more of these technical people, engineers and so on, that are going to be needed at this plant. And if any of you have been there and can observe the configuration that is going on there, all the pipes and...if my uncle would have had a still like that in the twenties and thirties, why he'd be a millionaire by now, but there's a lot of alcohol going to come out of that thing and a lot of sucrose, a lot of by-products, cattle feed. Well, yeah, he was in jail, Floyd, yes, he was. But anyway...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: one minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...you can't imagine the things that are coming out of this plant and in another 10 years I don't know what's going to happen. Maybe the 600 acres they bought there isn't going to be big enough. Who knows? But it's quite an operation and being familiar with that area, I can see nothing but good coming from it and I don't believe a penny a bushel right now is going to hurt that corn producer that much for the good that it's going to do not only for the farmers, but for the state as a whole. SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Lynch, followed by Senators Bromm and Bohlke.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. Chairman and members, I live in a district that has no banks and only one private high school. I have no high schools. I've got a lot of poor people and I've got a lot of small businesses. I've got everybody that probably gets no tax break at all. So when Ernie raises the question of political trade-offs, what do you got for me? Anything at all that can help? Nothing. Micron doesn't help. LB 775 doesn't help. These kinds of subsidies don't help. We're going to spend \$75 million, that's okay maybe. We can't even get enough
