CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 668.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 668 is advanced. LR 6CA, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 6CA, introduced by Senator Dierks and others. (Read.) The resolution was introduced on January 6th, at that time was referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee for public hearing. The resolution was advanced to the floor with committee amendments attached, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Robinson, on the committee amendment.

SENATOR ROBINSON: LR CA (sic) is a proposed constitutional amendment dealing with the number of signatures required on initiative and referendum petitions. There's a long and complex history behind this subject with...which others may touch on, but basically the issue is being dealt with so that the citizens of Nebraska may have the chance to adopt a consistent and fair manner of placing measures on the ballot through the petition process. The committee amendment combines some provisions of both LR CA (sic) and LR 22CA, which was introduced by Senator Schimek. It creates a new article of our constitution entitled "Initiatives and Referendums". Sections 1 and 2 of this new
