

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And by the first time, you mean the conference we are talking about now?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are the delegates going to choose the board members or will that be something that the legislatures will do?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I can only tell you from what the basis of my information is because it is not laid out in here is that they will, the delegates will meet and I assume ahead of time when you saw this steering committee, that they are going to propose some bylaws to carry out who is on the board, how they are selected, and that that will be done at that point in time. And so in terms of is that done? No. Am I aware...is there some set of bylaws? I have never seen them and I don't know what they are if there are some out there.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you. Members of the Legislature, now that if this language that Senator Beutler is offering is adopted, then we can get into some of the nuts and bolts issues of the kind that I'm trying to talk to Senator Kristensen about now. I do want to know what this organization will actually be. The board of directors, if there is one, how many will be on that board, what the representation will be in terms of geograph...geography. I am not a member of a political party, but since it is supposed to be nonpartisan, I guess they will try to have some kind of partisan parity involved. I want to know whether they are going to look at gender, race, and other things that ought to go into this being truly representative of the demographics of legislatures throughout...
