SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Hall, there are no further lights on. We are voting on the committee amendments. Do you have a closing?

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President and members. The committee amendments have been adopted by the amendment that I offered changing the presiding officer to speaker with regard to who will appoint the group that will attend and will represent the Legislature. Senator Kristensen offered the amendment that was adopted that dealt with the constitutional convention prohibition, if you will. There was the Beutler amendment that was adopted that dealt with the basically clean-up measures as well as the delegation makeup, and then, again, Senator Kristensen offered the language that was a change with regard to the intent language, and struck the previous intent language that was in the bill. With that, those are the amendments that were adopted to the committee amendments, and, remember, the committee amendments changes, basically, said that...took the delegation from five to seven. With that, Mr. President, I would move for the adoption of the committee amendments to LR 16.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Committee amendments are adopted. Is there anything further on the resolution?

CLERK: I have nothing further to the resolution, Mr. President.
