

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. On a constitutional amendment it would be 103,322.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is correct.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right, then what would a volunteer petitioner have to raise?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: If they were initiating a law it would be 34,441, approximately.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Under a constitutional amendment, right?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, no, no, I'm sorry, it's...it is statutory. If you read across your chart there, go over to your right yet. I can see what you're working on. You see the 68,000 there under the paid.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And then under the volunteer it's to the right of that, 34,000.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And for the constitutional amendment for the volunteer it would be 55,000.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right, but what if it's declared unconstitutional, then what would we fall back to?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Then we fall back to the numbers under 6CA, that portion of the bill that was the original Dierks bill and those numbers are...let me see if I can see here, they're about 55,000 also for the statutory.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay, how about the constitutional amendment?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, I'm sorry, the constitutional amendment would be about 55. I've got to find those figures and they don't seem to be here right at my fingertips.
