

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR MATZKE: ...at present, it doesn't change the present circumstances. That confidentiality must be maintained. The only time that there would be an opening of that factual situation would be where the biological father is not known, of course, and notice by publication has to be given.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Matzke. On the Lindsay amendment, Senator Bromm. Senator Witek, on the Lindsay amendment.

SENATOR WITEK: No.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator...

SENATOR WITEK: I just wanted to...to...it's not exactly on the Lindsay amendment, but to just say to Senator Matzke, I guess for future questions on what if she lies on this? And so I'll talk to you off the floor on that.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lindsay, to close on your amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I'd waive closing.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Closing is waived. The question is the adoption of the Lindsay amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Lindsay's amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The Lindsay amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: We are back then to discussion...discussing the bill. Senator McKenzie, would be the first speaker. I don't see Senator McKenzie. Senator Hall, for discussion of the bill.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Again, I rise to question some of the...at least the process that's going to be put in place by LB 716 (sic). I want to stand up and say I
