I know at least for part of this act, I don't know if for all of it, I haven't been able to read through it fast enough, that there exists the power of eminent domain and I guess my first question to you is, generally speaking, if we're extending this to all the counties, does that in fact mean that the counties will have the power of eminent domain with regard to the tracts of land that they can acquire?

SENATOR FISHER: If, in fact, in which I do think of it as true, this industrial development corporation does hold the power of eminent domain.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, and can that power be exercised within the corporate limits of a municipality?

SENATOR FISHER: I couldn't tell you at this time. I'd have to...you know, I don't know. I would...you see, if you're talking about the Nebraska Industrial Development Corporation Act. I would think they would fall in there, but it would be speculation on my part at this time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, thank you, Senator.
